

User 1 Summary: User 1 was mostly satisfied with their experience on our page. They rated things mostly low, but enjoyed the idea and designs of our website.

User 2 Summary: User 2 was NOT feeling our website. They really recommended we look heavily into expanding and refining our UX, as it was generally lacking for them in their test. Filter results on the results page and a better nav bar were mentioned.

User 3 Summary: User 3 liked the general idea and theme of our website, and was excited for the finished product, but mentioned that as it stands, it needs some love. Front end errors here and there, search and nav improvements, and filling empty space were mentioned.

User 4 Summary: User 4 was much more optimistic about our site, and loved the theming, colors, and layout. Only feedback was fixing the obvious issues and implementing similar features as previously mentioned.

User 5 Summary: User 5 was less optimistic about our site, but still got to see the vision and purpose over time. Similar feedback about the site- front-end styling, making interactivity clearer, adding more site info(!), making the text more legible on results, adding an easier way to search on the search AND results page.

User 6 Summary: User 6 seemed to mostly like it, but pointed out some of the previously mentioned missing features and design flaws. Navigation was a bit difficult since stuff was missing, and things being aligned left felt weird as well. Mostly happy with the search results, just wants the ability to filter and search (like everyone at this point).

User 7 Summary: User 7 is mostly satisfied with everything, but pretty much same as the last users, recommended some design improvements and making it a more seamless experience from home to results.

User 8 Summary: User 8 mostly liked everything, not too much said, but other than that echoed similar feelings on everything previously said.

User 9 Summary: User 9 mentioned how some choices may lead to confusion, like having the ability to search addresses makes people confused. Also having the media querying available for mobile is a must.

User 10 Summary: User 10 was NOT feeling most of our design choices, but also wasn't mad at the purpose or content of our website. Mostly happy with it, but also recommended we change the margins of home page and decrease blandness of other pages.

User 11 Summary: User 11 was not totally satisfied with everything, but also rated it very high for the ability to see places he had not been before, even as an LA native. Finishing the features and fleshing out the design are the final things he wanted.
